CARL D. HALL PICCOLO ARTIST COMPETITION

The Atlanta Flute Club is pleased to announce the **Carl D. Hall Piccolo Artist Scholarship**, given in memory of Carl D. Hall, one of our founding members and an avid supporter of the Atlanta Flute Club. The competition is open to full-time high school and college students who have not reached their thirtieth (30th) birthday. Applicants must be members of the Atlanta Flute Club and be current in their dues obligations. The competition will be by video audition, judged by a committee. The scholarship consists of a \$300 cash prize to be used to further the winner's music education, a custom piccolo headjoint from Pettry Piccolos, and an in-person 30-minute piccolo recital at the 2024 Flute Fair. The deadline for recorded video audition submission is February 1, 2024, and there is a \$50 application fee due upon submission.

Repertoire Requirements:

Two contrasting works: the program must contain compositions from at least two different periods of music (baroque, classical, romantic, impressionistic, contemporary).

You must be an AFC Member in order to compete.

YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION

The Atlanta Flute Club announces its twenty-second annual **Young Artist Competition**. The competition is open to full-time high school and college students who have not reached their thirtieth (30th) birthday. Applicants must be members of the Atlanta Flute Club and be current in their dues obligations (dues may be included when sending in application if not already paid). A preliminary recorded AUDIO ONLY audition is required. A committee will judge the preliminary audition, and three finalists will be chosen to compete at the AFC Flute Fair in 2024.

Prizes are as follows:

First place - \$1,000 and a full recital at the 2025 AFC Flute Fair

Second place - \$500

Third place - \$250

*Please note that finalists will be required to register for and attend the 2024 Flute Fair in-person. The deadline for preliminary recorded audition submission is February 1, 2024, and there is a \$50 application fee due upon submission.

Repertoire Requirements:

Two contrasting works: the program must contain compositions from at least two different periods of music (baroque, classical, romantic, impressionistic, contemporary).

The three finalists will compete live and in-person at the 2024 Flute Fair, each presenting a 25-30 minute program of their own choice. Finalists will be notified by February 15.

JUNIOR ARTIST COMPETITION

The Atlanta Flute Club is pleased to announce its Junior Artist Competition, Middle School and High School divisions. The Middle School division is open to students from 5th grade through 8th grade, the High School division is open to students from 9th grade through 12th grade. Applicants and teachers must be members of the Atlanta Flute Club and be current in their dues obligations. **Applicants, your membership fee will be automatically added to your application fee at checkout.** A preliminary recorded AUDIO ONLY ONE-TAKE (NO EDITING WHATSOEVER IS PERMITTED) audition is required. A committee will judge the preliminary audition, and three finalists will be chosen to compete at the AFC Flute Fair in 2024.

The first place winner will be featured in recital at the 2025 Flute Fair. Please note that finalists will be required to register for the 2024 Flute Fair.

The deadline for preliminary recorded audition submission is February 1, 2024, and there is a \$25 application fee due upon submission.

The six finalists will compete at the 2024 Flute Fair. The three middle school finalists will present a 10 minute program of their choice. The three high school finalists will present a 15 minute program of their choice. Finalists will be notified by February 15, 2024.

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FLUTES & PICCOLOS

Christina Smith's Very Special Flute: An Interview

Jessica Petrasek: For whom and by whom was your flute originally made, and in what year?

Christina Smith: My flute was handmade by Verne Q. Powell in 1938 for Joseph Mariano, who was the flute professor at the Eastman School of Music from 1935-1974, and principal flutist of the Rochester Philharmonic.

JP: Your flute catches the eye before it even comes out of the case, which is unusually long. Why the long case?

CS: The flute has an unusually long case because it has a one-piece body. It comes apart only at the barrel where the head joint fits into the body, and there is no separate foot joint so the tube is very long. It takes some getting used to for carrying around, but usually I just strap it across my back since it doesn't really fit into any traditionally sized gig bags! I think there are six platinum Powells which were handmade by Verne Powell, and this is the second one, but the only one with a one-piece body. Some people think he tried this style to see if the tube would vibrate better without the extra joint given that platinum is a heavier metal...I think he was on to something!

JP: The previous owner of your flute was Warren Little, your predecessor as Principal Flute of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra. It's incredible for an instrument to stay within the "orchestra family" like that. How did this happen?

CS: Yes, it is quite unusual, almost unheard of, that the same instrument be played for decades in a flute section by two different players! I know that Warren had the flute for many years, and just before he passed away he gave it to a family member, who contacted me. She knew that I played old Powell flutes, and asked if I might be interested in playing on it. I fell in love right away, and I ended up purchasing the flute. It's such a cool historical story that the flute has been played in the ASO for over 70 years!

JP: What do you love about your flute? What's unique about it, and how would you compare it to a modern instrument?

CS: There are many things I love about this flute. The first would be that it sounds and feels very orchestral to me. It can come out when it needs to, and blend equally well. It has a sound that is familiar to me because I grew up listening to LPs of the Philadelphia Orchestra and the NY Philharmonic, where those players were playing instruments very similar to this one. It has a little more depth and resistance than my other Powells, without being too heavy since the keys are made of silver. Unusually for a platinum flute, it plays the more delicate dynamics and colors easily and beautifully.

JP: If you played on a modern flute, would you still choose platinum?

CS: Great question! I would say that it would totally depend on the individual qualities of the flute. There are some fantastic modern flutes of all metals being made today, and each flute has its own unique qualities. I usually look more at the total package than the material when I'm trying flutes, and when guiding people who are looking for a new flute.

JP: Do you believe there is a perfect flute match out there for each of us? How important is the instrument to our musical voice?

CS: I think there can be flutes that I would call "a great fit" for each player. But in my experience, there is no flute that is perfect. Whether we are talking about tone, dynamic range, ease of playing, intonation...there are always things that a particular flute doesn't do very well. It becomes a question of what our priorities are, and what we are willing to tolerate to get a bigger return. I do think that it is important to have a flute which is able to express things the way we would like, even if it takes significant musical work to make this happen. For students, I like the idea of having a flute which they can grow into. Flutes are important to our musical voice, but I think that a great flutist is 95% the skill of the player and 5% the flute.

JP: Just for fun - who are your favorite flutists to listen to right now and why?

CS: Most people know that my all time favorite flutists to listen to are Jean-Pierre Rampal (pre-1975), and my teacher, Julius Baker. Yes, I am very unapologetically old school! There are so many incredible players playing today who I admire, as well as some others from the past, both in the orchestral and solo realms. Pahud, of course. Emily Beynon in Concertgebouw. Andreas Blau (I love his farewell concert with the Berlin Philharmonic where he plays the Reinecke Concerto). Peter Lukas Graf, Michel Debost, Mark Sparks, Barthold Kuijken to name just a few more. I have my eye on Yubeen Kim, the amazing new principal of the San Francisco Symphony-he might just change the face of American flute playing!
